THE Independent Broadcasting Authority (IBA) is responsible for Independent Television (ITV, including TV-am and Channel 4), and Independent Local Radio (ILR), in the United Kingdom. Independent Broadcasting is completely self supporting: no income is received from licence fees or other public funds. The programme companies appointed by the IBA obtain their revenue from the sale of spot advertising time in their own areas; and pay the IBA a rental to cover its costs in administering the system and operating its national network of transmitters.
